Our partners from the University of Lisbon also shared some thoughts on who they've been inspired by in these short 30 second <u>videos</u>. Nobel Run






Project workshops and events

Our partners have also been busy organising and attending events. Oxford Brookes University organised three different topics: Gender-mainstreamine incentives scheme for incorporating the gender dimension in research and innovation and gender-sensitive methodology and reporting.
